



CHIROPRACTIC COMPENSATION REVIEW COMMITTEE

TERMS OF REFERENCE

Purpose:

The Chiropractic Compensation Review Committee (CCRC) negotiates contracts for chiropractic services with third party paying agencies including Workers' Compensation Board (WCB) and Saskatchewan Government Insurance (SGI), and other stakeholders as needed.

Membership:

The Committee shall consist of a minimum of two members. In appointing membership, the Board will seek members who possess the following competencies and experience:

- Have served in a CAS leadership role for at least 5 years and understand the complexities of negotiations and third-party payers; and
- Have at least 10 years of experience in chiropractic practice and can provide strategic advice to the CAS Board, considering the many factors and risks in issues being considered.

Responsibilities:

Responsibilities of the Chiropractic Compensation Review Committee include:

- Preparing for negotiations with third-party paying agencies, identifying issues that are important to the profession;
- Meeting with the third-party agencies to negotiate monetary and non-monetary issues;
- Liaising with and providing recommendations to the CAS Board regarding negotiations and potential ratification of new agreements; and
- Providing advice to the Executive Director on issues arising relating to third-party paying agencies.

The CAS Executive Director will provide strategic support to the CCRC in fulfilling its mandate.

Accountability:

The CCRC is accountable to the CAS Board of Directors, and will provide regular reports to the Board, as well as identification of any urgent issues, as needed.

Resources:

Expenses and honoraria, if required, will be provided as per CAS policy. The Committee shall have access to the Executive Director, as needed, to support the work of the Committee.
