Silvano Mior DC, FCCS(C), PhD

Dr. Mior is the Director, Research Partnerships and Health Policy and Professor, Department of Research at CMCC. He is an Adjunct Professor, Faculty of Health Sciences at Ontario Tech University, Senior Scientist at the Institute for Disability and Rehabilitation Research, and Adjunct Professor, Institute of Health Policy Management and Evaluation, University of Toronto. He previously served as Senior Clinical Advisor in the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care in Ontario, contributing to policy matters related to rehabilitation health professionals. He has participated in international and national committees establishing guidelines for quality assurance and standards of chiropractic practice. He has authored more than 120 articles and several book chapters in areas related to clinical chiropractic practice and outcomes. Dr. Mior's research interests are in the areas of clinical outcomes and program evaluation, health services, assessing models of interdisciplinary patient-centred collaborative practice, and understanding patients' experiences, expectations and safety in health care delivery.



Bill Hsu BSc, DACBR, DC, FCCR(C)

Dr. Hsu is an Associate Professor and Faculty Radiologist in the Division of Clinical Education at the CMCC. He was previously President of the Chiropractic College of Radiologists of Canada and was later an Assistant Professor at D'Youville College in Buffalo, NY. After earning his undergraduate degree in Biochemistry and a Doctor of Chiropractic degree at CMCC, he pursued and completed FCCR and DACBR certifications.

Dr. Hsu's research focuses on clinical indications for imaging and clinical presentation of various musculoskeletal entities. He has contributed articles to the Journal of the American Chiropractic Association, Journal of the Canadian Chiropractic Association, the Journal of Manipulative and Physiological Therapeutics and several other academic journals and books.



Peter Kim BSc, DC, FCCS(C)

Dr. Kim graduated from the Canadian Memorial Chiropractic College (Magna Cum Laude) in 1991. He taught at CMCC clinic as a primary clinician (Associate Professor) for approximately 20 years and then as a Director of Education and Patient Care. He is currently the Director of Development and Clinical Advancement at CMCC and is the main fundraiser for CMCC. He continues to practice, providing evidence-based, symptomatic management of MSK conditions to his patients. Dr. Kim is a published presenter, speaker and fellow of the College of Chiropractic Sciences.
